

new line of furniture, the Roseberry Collection, of which the china cupboard and the Savannah are the first pieces. "It's a work in progress; we hope to add new designs," she says of the collection, which is predominantly composed of white painted furniture. Carol loves going to flea markets, estate sales and auctions where she finds items like vintage tables, old wooden doors, crown molding and other materials to use for her unique and creative pieces.

For example, she transformed a vintage 12-pane glass door she found at one such shopping jaunt and was inspired to use it as the door of the china cupboard. She used beadboard for the backing and old pieces of wood for the shelves. Vintage crown moldings add a touch of elegance to the top. The cupboard is painted a distressed pale pink, which gives it a cottage feel.

The Savannah is a more rustic piece, formed from a vintage wooden door and table. Aged cast-iron brackets hold up another shelf made of reclaimed wood. The beauty of this project is that it can function in many ways: as a potting bench in the garden or as an outdoor bar when serving drinks for backyard parties. It can also be used as a baker's bench in the kitchen or a hall tree in the entryway.

Carol takes orders for custom designs on the Web site, but for a general idea on creating your own, she offers suggestions for materials below:

Materials for china cupboard:

- Vintage window or door
- Beadboard (for backing)
- Old pieces of wood (for shelves)
- White interior paint
- Thumb latch
- Vintage crown molding

Materials for Savannah:

- Vintage wooden door (for backing)
- Vintage table legs
- Cast-iron brackets
- Part of a vintage tabletop for the table and the top shelf.
- Use exterior paint if planning to have the shelf placed outdoors.
- Polyurethane to protect the white paint, which seals the moisture in the wood.
